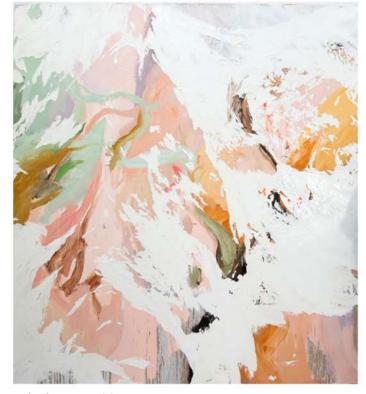

The aesthetic language of Rachel Valdes' work is based on the relationship between man and nature, in which the artistic object is the perfect connection between sensory spaces of both. The subject becomes the center of her work to the extent that landscape or imagined environments are activated, which, like memory, are reconstructed in a chaotic way, at times with areas of absence or excess. Memory is selective and both memories and forgetfulness are part of the emotional balance of a human being. Hence, in her work there are pictorial pauses that do not cease to be painting; as is the case in music when silence is also necessary.

The exhibit's title, "Tierra", must be in Spanish for its multiple meanings: tierra is soil, land, Earth, and much more. Experimentation is vital in her painting. The organic origin of both pigment and sensory experience reveals her experiences in those places from which she borrows and "steals" their essence. The artist considers these landscapes as a state of mind in which the elements of nature materialize. This interest comes from her experimentation with photography and installations of cubes and mirrors. Like Borges, Valdes has lost the fear of being the culprit, of multiplying the world and making it uninhabitable. Mirrors for Rachel have a generative, dreamlike effect: "Everything happens and nothing is remembered / in those crystalline cabinets / where, like whimsical rabbis, / we read books from right to left" (J.L. Borges: Los espejos). The recent pictorial work of Rachel Valdes also bursts into the experience of the receiver: it subtracts from it, inserts the doubt of the unlived memory, accepts it or questions it a lot, but ends up inhabiting it because they share the truth of having taken the "Tierra" and having transformed it.
